# **IMPORTANT SECURITY REMINDER FROM ERIC DOBIS**

Our community has "No Soliciting" signs at both Villas and Bayport's entrance ways. If you encounter someone soliciting, ask for a business card (if you feel safe doing so). Call 911 and report it to them. There are many in our community heading north. This is common knowledge to those with ill intents. For this reason please keep a watchful eye on our community.

About three weeks ago a man in his mid-twenties wearing a dark blue polo shirt, black shorts, shoes and socks was walking in the area of Pendleton Place carrying a clipboard. I happen to be working out front of my home. I saw him looking into the garages of homes, and even walking into one of them. I asked him what he was doing. He told me he was checking if anyone wanted replacement windows. I mentioned the No Solicitation signs and that what he was doing wasn't allowed. He said he was okayed by the police and that he had permission to do so.

I should have asked for a business card. I didn't think of it. I told him that I was calling 911 to confirm his story. He left the area while I was calling. A sheriff stopped by about 15 minutes later to get more info. He took my description and said he would look around the neighborhood for the guy. The sheriff expected he would not find him and suggested that next time, if possible, ask for a business card, company name, and their name.

If you see anything out of the norm don't hesitate to call 911 and report it. Let's keep our community secure and safe. Safe travels to those headed north.
